R.E.

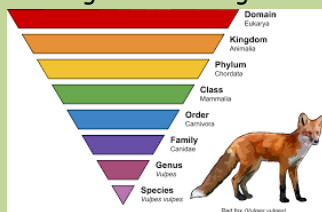
We will be studying "Why is the Torah so important to Jewish people?" The children will be learning and giving their ideas based on different religious scriptures.
