# Key vocab

- Phrase- a unit of music that has a musical sense of its own
- Melody- a sequence of pleasing sounds that make up a particular musical phrase.
- Ostinato- a continually repeated phrase.
- Pitch- how high or low sounds are.
- Dynamics- how loud or quiet music is.
- Duration- the length of time each note is played for.
- Duration- the length of time each note is played for.
- Tempo- how fast or slow music is.
- Notation- a symbol to represent a sound.
- Minim- a note played for half the duration of a whole note.
- Quaver- a note played for an eighth of the duration of a whole note.
