Creatures, great and small.

Science

Our topic this term is 'Living things and their habitats' where we will explore and investigate habitats of small creatures including nocturnal animals.

Home Learning

Attendance

We take attendance very seriously at St Paul's. Please ensure your child is in school EVERY day and on time. Thank you.

Regular practise of simple addition and subtraction number facts and telling the time would be of huge benefit to the children this year. When reading, talking about the story and making predictions are important skills to practise.

Maths

This term we are focusing on fractions and looking at halves, quarters and thirds. The children will investigate what is needed to make a whole, how to find a fraction of an amount and a fraction of a shape.

Please continue to use Numbots for 15 minutes every week to support your child to learn addition and subtraction facts within 20. Knowing facts like this can support your child's mental maths as they progress through the school so are a really important skill to learn.

Computing

In Computing, the children are looking at creating pictograms on a computer programme. This links with Maths and Science later in the year.
